It has been a busy start to the year for the AYA Cancer PSP. We have been hard at work processing the research questions submitted in the first AYA Cancer PSP survey. There were over 1,900 research questions submitted! We are hearing just how many uncertainties and priorities there are for AYA cancer research in Canada. We are currently working on organizing and summarizing the research questions that were submitted and look forward to sharing them with you in an interim prioritization survey coming soon.

Create Steering Group

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Composed of equal representation of patients, caregivers, and clinicians. *The first Steering Group meeting was held on April 18, 2023.

Survey #1: Gather Evidence Uncertainties



Patients, caregivers, and clinicians will respond to a survey that asks what questions they want answered by research.

Evidence Checking

The long list of questions is checked against existing research evidence. Any questions that have been answered will be removed.

Survey #2: Interim Priority Setting

To reduce the remaining long list, patients, caregivers, and clinicians will vote on the most important questions. This is the short list of questions.

Final Workshop

The highest ranked 25-30 questions are discussed. Patients, caregivers, and clinics agree the "Top 10" list of priorities.


The Canadian Centre for Applied Research in Cancer Control (ARCC)






Pink Pearl Canada
